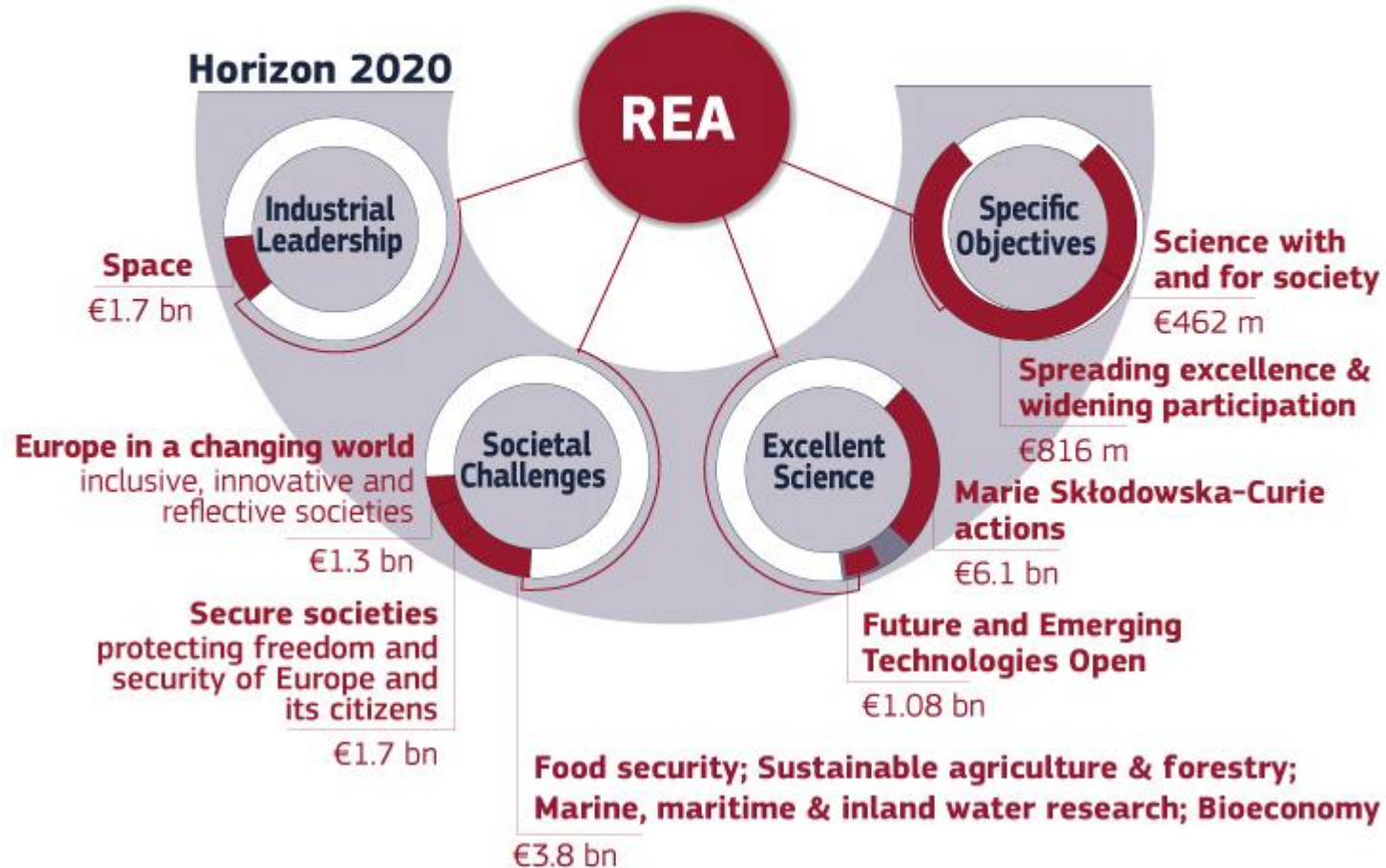

ITN Innovative Training Networks

What does it offer?

High-quality research training delivered through international and interdisciplinary networks, industrial doctorates or joint doctorates

Who applies?

International networks of research organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors

Who is funded?

Researchers at doctoral level (less than four years of full-time research experience and no doctoral degree)



IF Individual Fellowships

What does it offer?

Opportunities to work on personal research projects by moving between countries and possibly sectors to acquire new skills

Who applies?

Individual researchers together with the host organisation

Who is funded?

Postdoctoral researchers



RISE Research and Innovation Staff Exchange

What does it offer?

The exchange of staff members involved in research and innovation to develop sustainable collaborative projects and the transfer of knowledge

Who applies?

International networks of research organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors

Who is funded?

Researchers, technical, administrative and managerial staff of any nationality and at all career levels



COFUND Co-Funding of Regional, National and International Programmes

What does it offer?

Regional, national or international programmes to foster excellence in researchers' training, mobility and career development

Who applies?

Organisations funding or managing doctoral programmes or fellowship programmes

Who is funded?

Researchers at doctoral and postdoctoral level

What are Individual Fellowships?



An Experienced Researcher can submit only one proposal to this call for proposals.



European Fellowships

For fellows coming to or moving within Europe
duration 12-36 months for CAR
duration 12-24 months for other EF



Global Fellowships

For fellows from Europe going to Third countries (12-24 months) returning to Europe (12 months)



Total duration 24-36 months

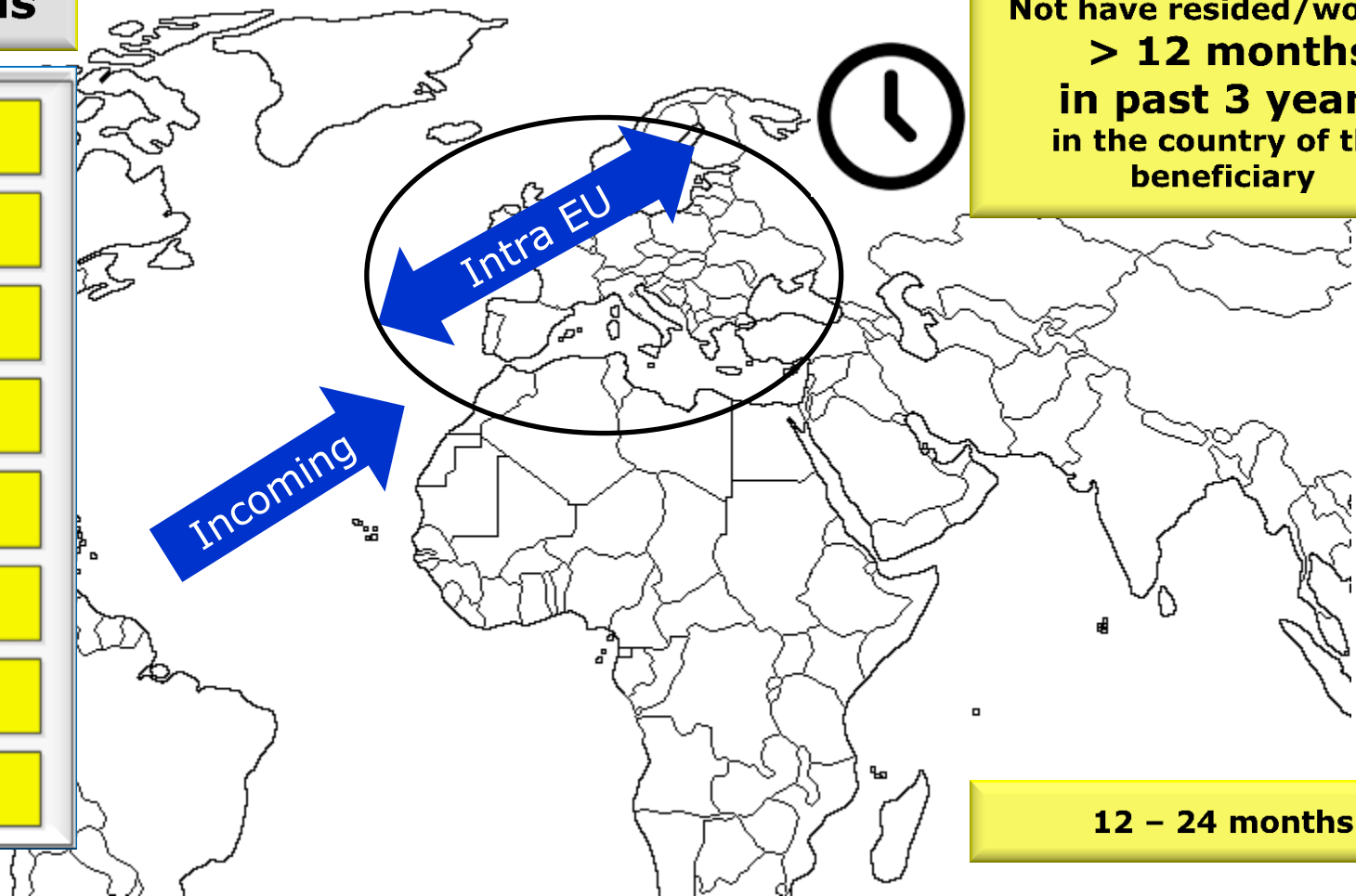

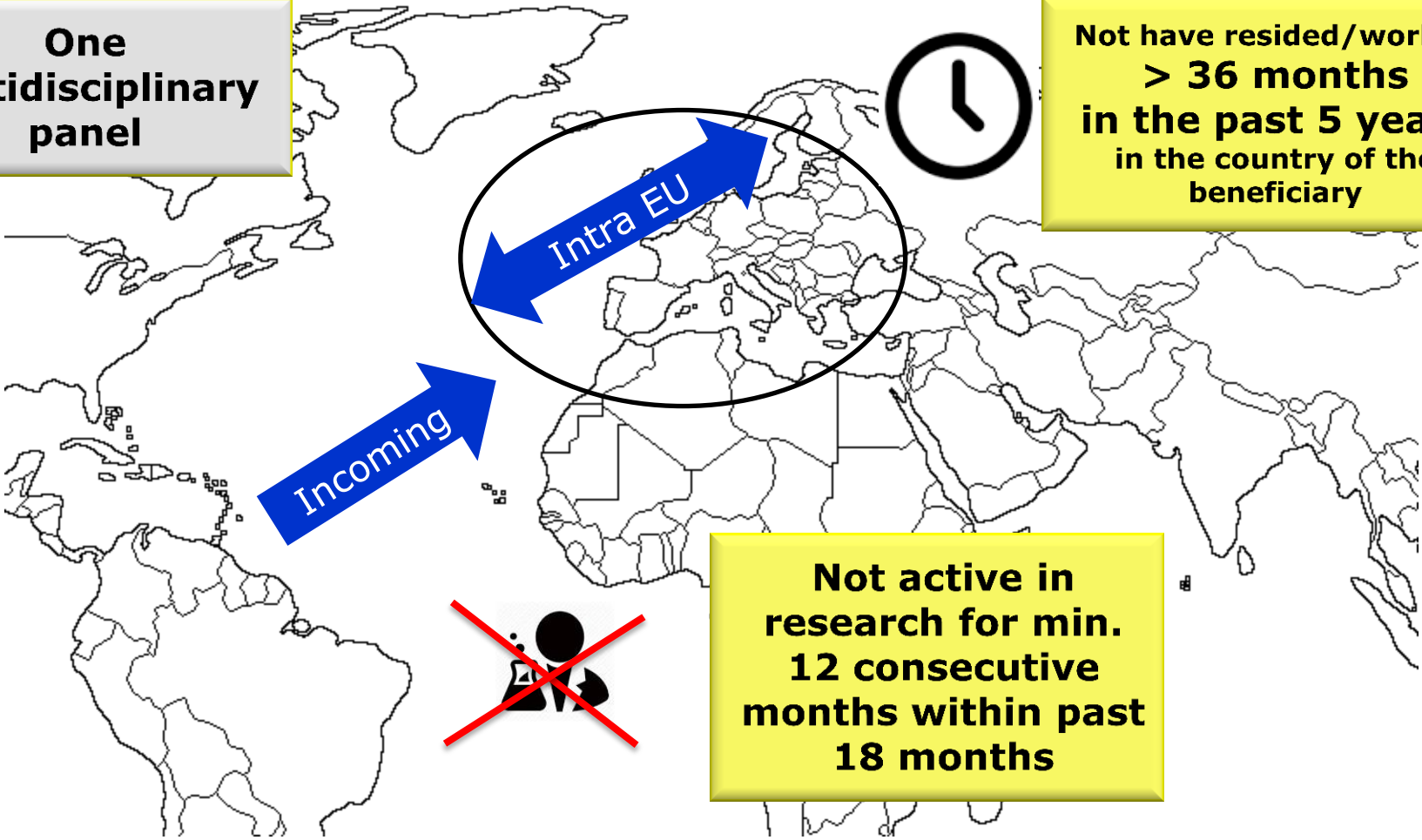

Not active in research for min. 12 consecutive months within past 18 months

12 – 36 months



Definition of CAREER BREAK in research:

Not have been active in research for at least 12 consecutive months within the 18 months immediately prior to the deadline for submission of proposals (10/03/19 to 09/09/20).

active in research is determined on the basis of:

- A. fellowships in research domain or**
- B. employment contracts in research domain**

The **professional status** should be clearly explained in the proposal, **both in part A and B** (e.g. *unemployment, parental/sick leave, no fellowship/employment contract in research*)

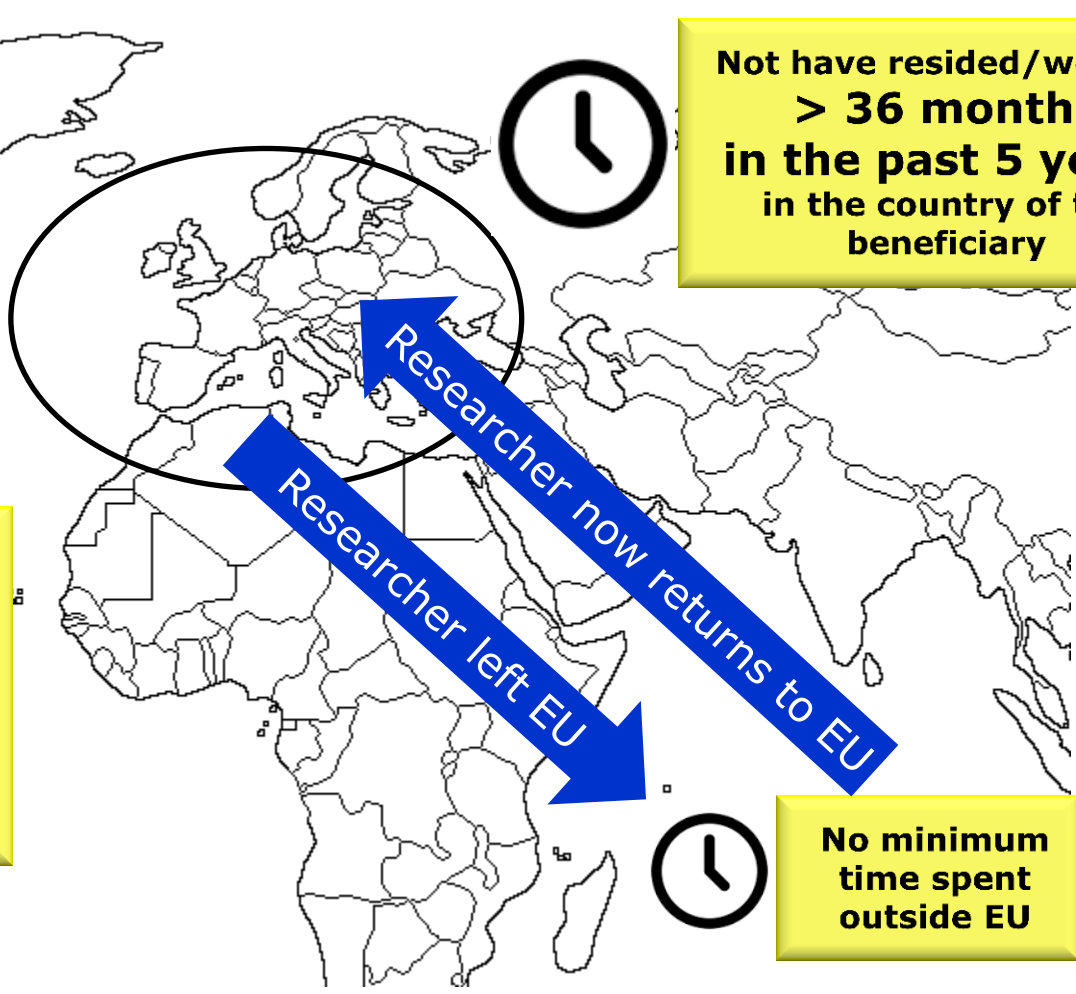

Not have resided/worked > 12 months in the past 3 years, in the country of the Third Country partner organisation (outgoing phase)

If not European, the researcher must have spent at least 5 years in Europe before leaving (long term residency)



DOES NOT sign the Grant Agreement

DOES NOT recruit the researcher

DOES NOT claim costs directly from the action

Partner Organisation

- Location: Third Country (not MS or AC)
- Nominates a Supervisor for the researcher
- Provides a signed **Letter of Commitment** (in the proposal)

What are secondments?



A transfer of knowledge which contributes significantly to the impact of the fellowship.

Fellowship Duration	Maximum duration of secondment
\leq 18 months	3 months
$>$ 18 months	6 months

- Secondment should be clearly described in proposal
- Can be a single period or divided into multiple shorter periods
- Can be at more than one partner organisation **located in MS/AC**
- Can be to an institution in the same country as the beneficiary
- No letter of commitment needed
- Is different from **short visit** (e.g. field work), which can be done in a TC
- A special rule for **Global Fellowships**

Special Needs Grants



For recruited or seconded researchers/staff members with disabilities whose long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments.

The special needs allowance will take the form of a lump sum awarded in the form of a low value grant to an identified beneficiary and will cover up to 100% of eligible costs.

It will be limited to a maximum of EUR 60,000 per researcher.

For details please refer to the MSCA Work Programme and information available on the Participant Portal.

The IF proposal should NOT contain any information on disabilities (separate grant and evaluation).

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Proposals: submitted exclusively electronically, using the Participant Portal.

Part A: administrative details

Section 1 – General Information

Section 2 – Administrative data of participating organisations (supervisor(s), researcher)

Section 3 – Budget: information on the duration (person-months) to calculate the total requested EU contribution.

Section 4 – Ethics: identifies any ethical aspects of the proposed work. Even if there are no issues, you must simply confirm that none of the ethical issues apply to the proposal.

Section 5 – Call specific questions request declarations related to eligibility and personal data, together with questions on any secondment in Europe.

Proposal Part B



The "core" of the proposal – the structure below is mandatory
!!There is no cover page or table of contents!!

DOCUMENT 1 (10-PAGE LIMIT APPLIES)

START PAGE COUNT (MAX 10 PAGES SECTIONS 1-3)

- 1. EXCELLENCE
- 2. IMPACT **MAX 10 pages**
- 3. IMPLEMENTATION

STOP PAGE COUNT (MAX 10 PAGES SECTIONS 1-3)

DOCUMENT 2 (NO OVERALL PAGE LIMIT APPLIED)

- 4. CV OF THE EXPERIENCED RESEARCHER
- 5. CAPACITIES OF THE PARTICIPATING ORGANISATIONS
- 6. ETHICAL ASPECTS
- 7. LETTERS OF COMMITMENT OF PARTNER ORGANISATIONS (**only for GF**)

Part B is submitted as two separate pdf documents.

Of the maximum 10 pages applied to sections 1, 2 and 3, applicants are free to decide on the allocation of pages between the sections.

However, the overall page limit will be strictly applied, excess pages will be blanked out and experts will not be able to read them.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to verify that the submitted .pdf documents are readable and are within the page limit.

Descriptors



Chosen by applicants and experts for pre-allocation of proposals to the experts.

Number of descriptors ranges from 3 to 5. Applicants select the descriptors **in order of importance** with 1st being the most important.

Guide for Applicants contains a breakdown of scientific areas into descriptors.

Applicants must:

- 1) Select the area of research (e.g.: CHE), i.e. the core discipline of the proposal
- 2) Within the most relevant sub-area of research (e.g.: C1-Synthetic Chemistry and Materials), select two **descriptors** that best characterises the subject of the proposal
- 4) Select a mandatory **Third descriptor**: from **any of the eight (8) areas of research** is mandatory.
- 5) If needed, applicants **may add further two (2) additional descriptors** chosen freely from any area.

Evaluation Roles



Evaluators (3600 in 2019)

- Evaluate proposals in a fair and independent way
- Submit individual evaluation reports
- Participate in Consensus discussions / Approve Consensus Reports
- Some also act as **Rapporteurs** for of their proposals
 - Draft and submit consensus report
 - Moderate remote consensus report discussion

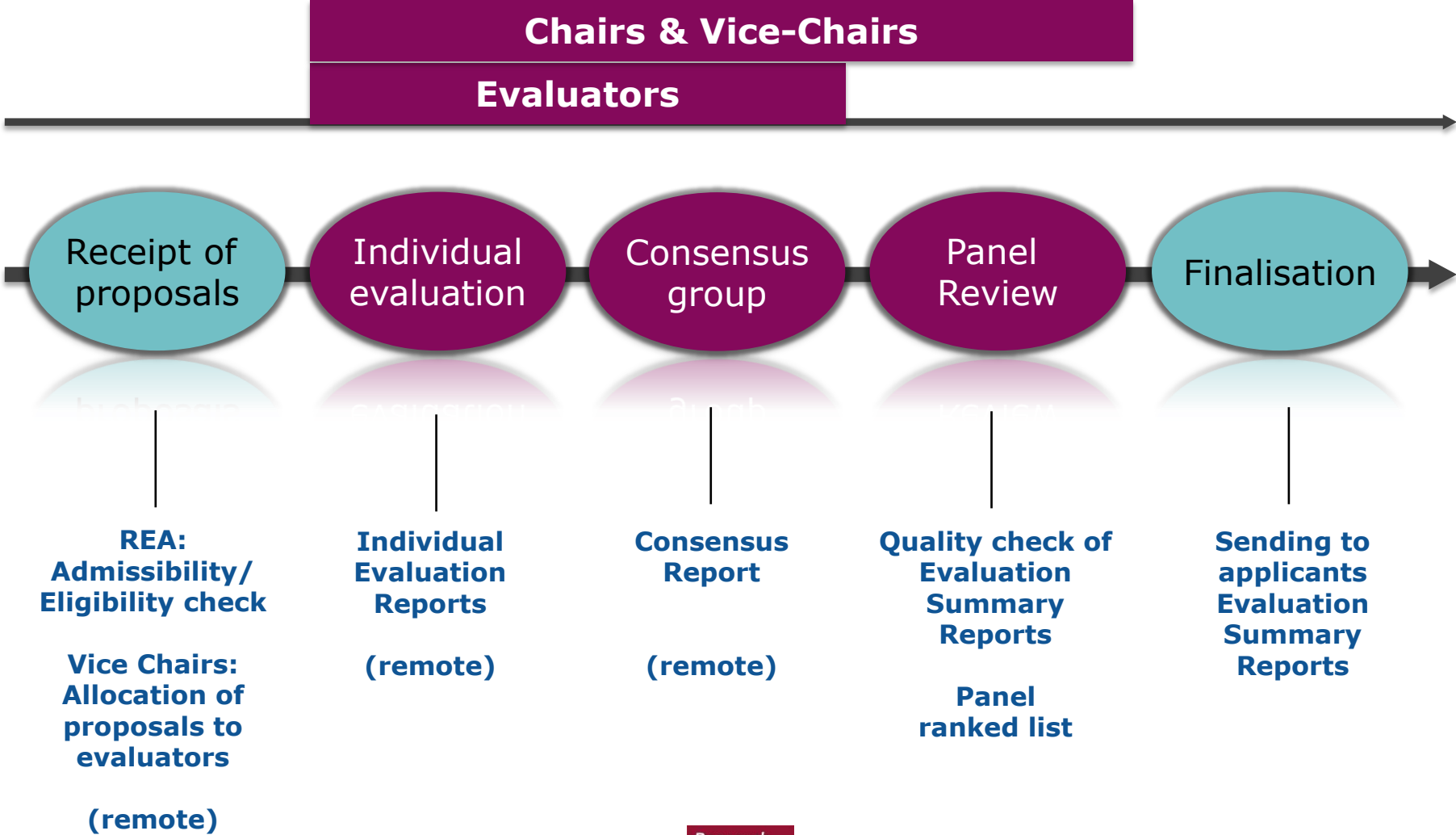
Chair- and Vice-chairpersons, or 'C/VC' (450 in 2019)

- Assist evaluation management and monitor progress
- Finalise allocation of proposals to experts
- Do not evaluate proposals
- Quality check individual / consensus / evaluation summary reports
- Attend the panel review

Independent Observer (1)

- Observe the overall evaluation process
- Provide advice / improvement suggestions to the REA

Postdoctoral fellowships



- Continue supporting post-doctoral research and careers
- Clarify and simplify, a **single action**
- Deliver skilled people **to academia and beyond**
 - Intensify exposure/secondments to (training in) entities beyond academia
 - Improved guidance towards career development (plan & supervision)
- Manage the increasing demand to maintain high-quality selection
 - Limit research experience
 - Require PhD degree
 - Restrict resubmissions below quality threshold
