Short description of the department/ laboratory/ research group	On the basis of the analysis of the experiences of minors who in the first half of the 20th century were forced to emigrate from Germany and from the countries annexed to the Reich, we intend to develop an empirical cognitive approach to the forced migration of minors, a nd to the related dynamics of acculturation and language learning in the 21st century. The concept of voice (Blommaert 2005) is central to this task, in order to give expression to the experiences and emotions lived at the time of emigration and narrated retrospectively decades later. The analysis aims to cross -reference data from different sources in order to ensure a plural perspective. Starting point are two collections of German-language interviews with people who were forced to leave their original ho me country in the 1930s: the so-called Israelkorpus, collected in Israel between 1989 and 2019 (Betten 2013), which contains interviews with people who emigrated to



Palestine, and the corpus FEGB (Flight and Emigration to Great Britain), collected in 2017 (Thüne 2019), consisting largely of people who emigrated with the Kindertransport action. The corpora are stored at the Archive for spoken German (AGD).

The project plans to add to these other data, both audio and textual, related to child and youth emigration to Belgium, France and Sweden (Maier -Wolthausen 2021), as well as in relation to migration from Poland (Craig -Norton 2012). The research aims at identifying the elements required to develop a narrative cartography (Pearce 2008) of experiences relate d to forced migration, in particular traumas and key memories to processes of acculturation and learning new languages. Methodologically the research is situated within the qualitative approach, integrated by mixed methods approaches (Steen & Liedtke 2019; Flinz & Ruppenhofer 2021). The analyses will attempt to combine a wide range of approaches, making use of the category of 'chronotope' (Bakhtin 1979); underlying both linguistic and literary analyses are memory studies (Rothberg 2009).

The 'mapping' envi sages an annotation of the 'places' and 'spaces' (Flinz & Ruppenhofer 2021) recurring in the corpus (audio interviews and texts, both autobiographical and (auto)fictional), as well as the experiences related to them. Annotation will be carried out through the MAXQDA software (Kuckartz & Rädiker 2019).

The identification of the chronotopes in the narratives under investigation, the categorisation of the places and experiences connected to them, the articulation of the voice and their collation will result in 'narrative threads' from which to filter the
