2 TEACHING

2.1 TEACHING INNOVATION AND DEVELOPMENT

• I am a very experienced teacher. I have over 20 years experience of teaching at undergraduate and post graduate levels. I have also taught on Doctoral research units. My teaching interests complement my research interests – namely sexual and reproductive health, adolescent health and health promotion. My research teaching involves mainly qualitative research but also questionnaire development, survey design and experimental designs. I also teach biological subjects related to sexual and reproductive health – reproductive A&P, reproductive system pathology, HIV pathogenesis and STI pathology and management.

- I have extensive experience of the NHS LBR environment. I have been closely involved in LBR since 1991 both in terms of teaching but also in the development of units and courses, at both UG and PG level in response to NHS commissioning requirements. My involvement with LBR over this time span has given me excellent insight into this educational environment. In my HE career I have developed and led to approval HIV courses, Family Planning and reproductive health courses, STI courses, a Cervical Cytology course and a Bachelors Degree in Sexual Health. I also led the development of one of the first 'Health Advising in Genito-Urinary Medicine' courses in the UK as part of a Department of Health pilot.
- As Head of Taught Postgraduate Programmes in the School of Nursing and Midwifery at the University of Sheffield (2006-2009) I led a successful PGT strategy that saw PGT student registration rise from 14 in Sept 2006 to 78 in Sept 2009 an increase of over 450%. My PGT role also encompassed the development of 5 new PGT programmes.
- My work on Department of Health and English National Board for Nursing (ENB) HIV and sexual health education projects produced teaching guides and open learning materials. These publications have been disseminated internationally and have been highly influential in the development of nurse education in the area of HIV/sexual health.
- I have delivered papers on HIV and sexual health teaching at numerous conferences including papers at the Department of Health and international HIV conferences. These papers were related to my development of a new approach to sexual health teaching which used historical film clips and my development of case study approaches to ethical dilemmas in AIDS care.
- I have presented papers on my work blending sociology and sexual health nursing practice at several international HEI's including the National Yang Ming University of Taiwan (Taiwan's leading nursing research university) and the University of Western Sydney (one of the top Australian Nursing schools).
- I am recognized internationally for my work on School Nurses and sexual health and have delivered keynote papers and run workshops on this topic for the World Health Organization in China in 2010. I gave the Key note Address to the International School Nurse conference, Hong Kong, 2011.
- I am also trained in online learning both teaching and programme design. I have led online courses and also developed online units.

5.1 PREVOUS RESEARCH LEADERSHIP

- As a key member of the Faculty's executive group and research committee I worked in partnership with the Director of Research to produce the schools extremely successful RAE return in 2008. This work constituted an extremely important stage in re-establishing the nursing schools national and international standing following the recent significant changes to Nursing at the University. I played a key role in the development and implementation of the schools research strategy– again a crucial process that re-established a research culture in the newly formed school and centre for health and social care studies. I have been active in promoting the schools research profile nationally and internationally a vital role during a time of change for the school and a role that has been instrumental in continuing the international research presence of the school of Nursing and Midwifery.
- As Post Graduate Tutor for the School I play a central role in developing the PGR strategy for the school. This includes ensuring the quality of the PGR student experience. Monitoring supervision and student progress and developing PGR recruitment strategy.

5.2 CURRENT RESEARCH LEADERSHIP

- As a member of the Faculty Executive and associated committees I am closely engaged with preparations for the forthcoming Research Excellence Framework assessment exercise. I am also involved with the development of the Faculty research strategy and the development of the research groups in the Faculty.
- My collaborative work in Asia has been instrumental in securing a steady stream of visiting international students from Taiwan and China. This work created a new income stream for the school and is also an important element of the Faculty's international research profile.
- I regularly undertake consultancy work in the NHS on nursing research development and am currently engaged in research development in the internationally recognised *Porterbrook* Sexual and Relationship therapy clinic.

5.3 RESEARCH AREAS

• I am one of the leading nurse researchers in the field of sexual and reproductive health nursing. My research in this area has three closely linked strands. Firstly, my work in family planning clinics has provided new and unique insights into nursing

practice both in terms of clinical work and medical sociology. My sociological work into contraceptive counselling is the first of its kind internationally. Secondly, my HIV research focuses upon staff reactions to HIV – including work on confidentiality, stigma and stress. The third strand explores sex education and sexual health services in various care settings – particularly adolescent sexual health services in primary care, School based sexual health and mental health environments. I am also expanding into the area of psycho-sexual practice and have publications and clinical links in this growing area of sexual health care.

- Throughout my academic career I have always maintained close links with clinical practice and am used to working in NHS sexual and reproductive health settings and clinicians to develop research agendas. I have close links with all strands of sexual health clinical services ranging from Family Planning services, through STI care and teenage pregnancy to psychosexual therapy. In those areas I have developed research capacity and also helped clinical staff to publish.
- In addition to my main field of activity I am also active in wound care and chronic illness nursing practice. I have publications that concern wound dressing effectiveness, and wound care compliance. I also co-authored one of the first papers to explore patients' experiences of malignant wounds in Asia with colleagues from Taiwan. I have also collaborated on projects relating to chronic illness particularly COPD. I have also managed to forge links between my research areas as evidenced by paper on 'Sexuality and Chronic illness' at the Pan –Pacific Cancer care conference in Hong Kong 2009.
- I specialise in qualitative research methods and have attracted international invitations to present papers on this topic and also attracted international research students to the School based on this expertise. My qualitative work has principally involved exploring the relationships between nursing practice and sociological theories about sexuality, the body and power. I have been invited to give papers on qualitative research in several setting in Asia. I have a particular interest in Grounded Theory, but am also experienced in phenomenological and ethnographic work.
- I also have an interest in some quantitative research –especially survey/questionnaire design and attitude measurement particularly sexual attitudes and behaviour and have published studies of this nature.
