Projects

2019 ERC Antigone; Università di Genova, Nov 2020—ongoing: The project focuses on the investigation of processes of marginalisation and change in the European mountains and uplands, through archaeological and historical investigation and the study of material traces that environmental resources management and social interaction between different groups have left onto the rural landscape. As a PhD Student, I have been involved in the project, investigating processes of change and material traces of environmental resources management in Ligurian mountainous areas on the outskirts of Genoa.

I soldati che dissero NO; Istoreco, Reggio Emilia (Italy), Sept 2016—Sept 2017: The project contributed to the exhibition and educational programme concerning the study of Internati Militari Italiani (IMI) — military interned prisoners— during World War II. It consisted of carrying out historical research, writing texts for the exhibition and organisation fo a final event, open to the public, which discussed some specific stories and experiences of these soldiers. The project was connected to the study trip Viaggio della Memoria 2017 in Berlin. Several students across the whole Reggio Emilia province took part in it.

Every Button Counts; Istoreco, Reggio Emilia (Italy), Mar 2017—Sept 2017: European project lead by the English association 6 Million+, with partners in Poland, Italy (Istoreco) and Serbia. Through this project numerous events were organised, which focussed on intercultural dialogue and the role of memory/remembrance. Through meetings and group activities a final short documentary was realised, which was then presented during the concluding event of the project in Jan 2018. I took part into the project as an interpreter (Italian-English), while also working on the event organisation, and documenting the events/activities through photos and videos.

International Bomber Command Centre – Archive, University of Lincoln, Lincoln (England), Jan 2017—July 2017: Istoreco (Reggio Emilia) cooperated here with the University of Lincoln, one of the leaders of the project. Within Istoreco I worked on collecting interviews with witnesses of the Allied bombings of Reggio Emilia during World War II. Subsequently I took care of transcribing the interviews and make these accessible to the IBCC archive.

Other research activities

Cimiteri urbani della comunità Ebraica di Reggio Emilia (Urban Jewish cemeteries in Reggio Emilia, Italy), Istoreco, Reggio Emilia (Italy), Sept 2016-ongoing: The project has been carried out with the Institute of contemporary history and society and the history of the Resistance movement (Istoreco) in Reggio Emilia. This piece of research has studied Jewish urban cemeteries in Reggio Emilia between 16th and 20th centuries, their periods of use and how this changed over the centuries. It was based on the analysis of archival sources, historical maps and cartography, and the surveying of specific areas of the city. Within this project, the aim was to understand when these urban cemeteries were abandoned, closed and eventually disappeared. Furthermore, a database was developed to record burials and tombs of the Modern Jewish Cemetery (19th-20th centuries).
