

Jörg H. Gleiter is an architect and professor of Architectural Theory and since 2012 head of the department of Architectural Theory at the Technical University Berlin. From 2005-2012 he held the position of professor of aesthetics at Free University of Bolzano/Italy. Since 2021 visiting professor at Politecnico di Milano. He is the director of the ethics commission of the Faculty Planning, Building, Environment and 2015-2022 member of the academic senate of Technical University Berlin. 2002 PhD on *Critical Theory of the Ornament* and 2007 habilitation on *Friedrich Nietzsche and Architecture*, both at Bauhaus-University Weimar. Gleiter is an internationally reknown scholar who held various visiting professorships at Waseda University (Japan), Brown University (USA), Venice (Italy), Bauhaus Universität Weimar (Germany), Politecnico di Torino and Politecnico di Milano (Italy). 2008 he founded the book series *ArchitekturDenken* (Transcript Verlag Bielefeld). His main research interests are critical theory of sustainability and AI, architecture philosophy, critical theory and semiotics of architecture, architectural anthropology and ornament theory. Among his recent books are: *gleiters universum. architektur* (2023, in German); *Architekturtheorie zur Einführung* (2022, in German), *Architekturtheorie 1863-1938* (2018, in German) *Ornament Today. Digital, Material, Structural* (ed. 2012, in English) and *Friedrich Nietzsche und die Architektur* (2009, in German). Among recent journal articles are *Surplus of Form.
